Team Manager - Disability Adult Services

Positions Available - 2

Operating since 1974, Accredited Supports to the Community (ASC) is a not-for-profit charitable society that provides programs and services across south central Alberta for all ages with developmental disabilities.

This opportunity requires an experienced full-time Team Manager specializing in the coordination of supervising front-line staff in 24-hour residential and community services. This is a supervisory position supported under the direction of the agencies Coordinator(s) providing Level 2 services for adults with complex medical needs and disabilities in the areas of community access, inclusion, social connection, and home living.

This full-time position is based on a 40-hour work week and requires a rotation of days, evenings, and weekends with on-call coverage for 24-hour services. The starting wage is \$25.95 or \$27.02 (depending on credentials and proven experience).

Key aspects of this role include:

- Providing leadership, supervision, and evaluation to front-line support staff (CSW's) while planning and implementing according to individual and program needs. This includes thorough scheduling, monitoring, and providing direct coverage as required.
- Monitoring and managing service delivery; participating in the development and monitoring of client service and support plans with a person-first approach.
- Actively engaging and mentoring CSW's to model behaviour aligned with the culture, values, policies, and procedures of Accredited Supports to the Community.
- Communicate and gather information effectively in a variety of settings including one-on-one with staff and in team meetings.
- Committing to providing an exceptional experience for clients, CSW's, and staff within a challenging and exciting human services environment by setting the example of high-quality client-focused care.

The choice candidate will have:

- A minimum of 3 years' experience in leadership and/or supervisory roles in disability services, however other modeled experience in the Human Services sector will be considered.
- Well-developed team leadership, coaching, mentoring, communication, and problem-solving skills.
- Experience engaging and integrating persons with disabilities with their residing and neighboring communities.
- Experience supporting a variety of medical needs, familiarity with other community-based services.
- Experience with computers including Microsoft Word, Excel and Outlook.

Requirements:

- Valid driver's license and \$2million liability insurance vehicle insurance coverage.
- Class 4 driver's license or ability to obtain within 3 months of hire.
- Current and clear Vulnerable Sector Criminal Record Check provided on first day of employment.
- Standard First Aid/CPR Level C and AED
- Ability to be flexible to work a variety of shifts including overnights and some evenings and weekends as required, on-call; meeting the needs of the people served and our programs.
- ASC provides a comprehensive benefits package, health care spending account, Employer/Employee RRSP, an additional week of vacation time in the first year of employment, mileage and expense reimbursement, and continued internal professional development.
